A litter audit has identified the most messy streets in Semilong, Northampton.

Members of the area's community forum carried out the audit and recorded the number of incidents of litter per 100m of road.

The shops area of Semilong Road was found to be the messiest, with 154 incidents of litter, followed by Lower Semilong Road, Norfolk Street and Arnold Road.

Essex Terrace and Upper Priory Street were found to be the least littered.
